



Love One Another

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35

When you think of February, you often think of love. On Valentine's Day we celebrate romantic love. According to AI (artificial intelligence on the internet): "The origins of Valentine's Day are shrouded in mystery, but it is widely believed that the holiday has its roots in both Christian and ancient Roman traditions ^{1 2}. The Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine or Valentinus, all of whom were martyred. One legend contends that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death ¹.

"The association of Valentine's Day with romantic love is believed to have originated in the 14th and 15th centuries when notions of courtly love flourished, apparently by association with the "lovebirds" of early spring ^{2 3}. The first recorded association of Valentine's Day with romantic love was in the writings of Chaucer, who linked Valentine's Day to romance more or less by chance ³. Later poets, including Shakespeare, followed Chaucer's lead and helped create the romantic connotations we have today ³."

Wherever the link of St. Valentine's Day to romantic love, Christian love is an essential element of the Christian religion. Jesus summed up the commandments into two: love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself. It's important to keep these in mind.

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment. He ordered them (and us) to love another as he has loved us. This is a love that is described in one of my favorite hymns *What Wondrous Love Is This* (an Appalachian folk hymn) as "What wondrous love is this that caused the Lord of bliss to bear the dreadful curse for my soul,...." You see, Jesus took our sin upon himself to save us from the curse of death and being forever without God. That is part of what we contemplate during Lent. Why would God in the form of Jesus of Nazareth take on my sin and the punishment for it? Why would God be willing to die on a cross in order that I might be freed to love God and to live with him forever? The answer is—it's a mystery of our faith.

"And when from death I'm free, I'll sing on, I'll sing on, and when from death I'm free, I'll sing on! And when from death I'm free, I'll sing and joyful be, and through eternity I'll sing on, I'll sing on, and through eternity I'll sing on!" – What Wondrous Love Is This

Lent begins February 14th this year. We sit among the ashes of Ash Wednesday and we contemplate our unworthiness. We look ahead through the 40 days to the resurrection of our Lord. There's a lot to get through before we get there. There's the Last Supper, the arrest of Jesus, the trial, and his Jesus' death. Then there's the lonely Saturday when Jesus lay in the grave. Finally, finally, we get to Easter—the day of resurrection! Thanks be to God!
