## The Beginning of the Story

But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. Mark 16:6

This month is a rollercoaster of emotions in the church year. We start in the middle of Lent. Lent is a time for reflection upon our relationship with God and other people. Through these forty days we think about how to be better followers of Christ.

Many churches put away the "Alleluias" for Lent. They sing no songs which show joy. Some even have a box in which they "lock away" the "Alleluias" for Lent. But the truth is that Sundays are not included in the days of Lent. Sunday is always a feast day because it is the day that our Lord rose from the dead. Lent is a forty-day period beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on the day before Easter, excluding Sundays.

There are many traditions associated with Holy Week. The Sunday before Holy Week is Palm Sunday. This is the day we celebrate Jesus's Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem. The day on which the crowd hailed Jesus as king. By Thursday the crowd had begun to turn. It was on this day that Jesus instituted the Last Supper. He washed his disciples' feet. He prayed to have the cup pass from him. He was arrested. He was tried and convicted.

On Good Friday, Jesus was crucified. The death of a criminal. When he died, he gave up his soul to God. He declared, "It is finished." The curtain to the Holy of Holies was torn in two. The day turned black (maybe like the solar eclipse which is supposed to happen on April 8). For a moment, it was as if the whole world was in mourning. The body was hurriedly placed in a tomb because at dark the Sabbath would begin. The Jewish people figured days at sundown one day to sundown the next.

Then there was the long, long, lonely Saturday. Jesus lay in the tomb. It was the Sabbath, so nothing could be done with the body.

Finally, on Sunday morning, the women (or woman if you read John) went to the tomb and found it empty. They were told, "He is not here, he is risen!". Easter is the most glorious day of the year. The world went from darkness and sorrow to joyful and filled with the good news of Jesus Christ! Jesus's death is only the beginning of our story with God.

Every year we celebrate. The good news is that Jesus came as "God with us." He came as one of us, taking our form. He lived among us. He taught us how to live as people reconciled to God. He showed us love and mercy. He rose from the grave and sits at the right hand of God the Father. The story of God's people continues!

2 1/2 lbs. Chicken - cooked and shredded (I use Rotisserie Chicken.)
24 oz. Chicken Broth
28 oz. Green Enchilada Sauce
4 oz. Green Salsa
4 oz. can Diced Green Chilies
1 cup heavy cream (or) half & half
2 cups Monterey Jack cheese

Cook all ingredients in Crock Pot on high for 4 hours.

Garnish with Mexican Blend Cheese, Chopped Cilantro, Jalapenos, Avocados, Sour Cream, and Tortilla Chips.

# Our feeble prayers, our Father's response

In *He Still Moves Stones*, Max Lucado recalls the story of Derek Redmond, a 1992 Olympic competitor in the 400-meter race. Halfway through Redmond's semifinal run, a torn hamstring sent him tumbling to the ground. His dad, Jim, immediately ran onto the track. He met up with Derek, who, though crying, had managed to stand and was hopping forward.

"You don't have to do this," Jim said. But Derek insisted. "Well, then, we're going to finish this together," said Jim, who supported his son as he hobbled to the finish line. The crowd cheered and wept as Derek, with Dad's assistance, finished the race.



Lucado writes: "What made the father do it? ... Was it the strength of his child? No, it was the

pain of his child. ... God does the same. Our prayers may be awkward. Our attempts may be feeble. But since the power of prayer is in the One who hears it and not in the one who says it, our prayers do make a difference."
