2028 – It's a new year!

Sometimes it seems like we struggle so much among ourselves right now that we don't have the time or the energy to plan for tomorrow. What do we think this church will look like in 5 years? Will we all just be older with no growth and shrinkage only by death? Will we be planning to build a new building or change and expand the current building because we are bursting at the seams?

What would you like to see in our church in 5 years? Would you like to see our feeding programs (the Food Pantry, the Blessings Box, the Community Garden) enlarged? Or is it just too much trouble to see the hungry and give them something to eat? We get mired down in one person taking a whole bag of food from the Blessings Box and we sabotage what it is meant to be. Who are we serving?

Perhaps part of the problem with the Blessings Box is that you're not there to hear a simple "thank you" when they are taking from the box, and we step out at that time. You don't hear the people saying, "this church has saved my life." You don't hear them say, "that peanut butter you had in there was awesome." Maybe you should hear it and maybe it should be from the pulpit. Maybe it's my fault for not telling you how grateful they are.

We have other neighbors too. We have neighbors who are obviously not homeless. Some who obviously have paycheck left at the end of their bills. Many of our neighbors are older people. But we have several who are still able to bring a covered dish for a fellowship lunch.

Information obtained from Mission Insights finds that within a one-mile radius of our church, *people* believe that God is love and invites the world into a loving relationship. Fewer, but still a large number of people believe that they have a personal relationship with God.

Unfortunately, a large number of people living in our one-mile radius believe that the people in the church don't act as Jesus would act. They feel that believing in Jesus does not require participation in the church. They also believe that Jesus was both divine and human.

Our neighbors believe the family is key to social stability. They believe that tolerance is necessary for social peace and well-being. They believe that America has a moral duty to be a force of good in the world. They believe that America is losing its place as a world leader.

73.4% in the one-mile radius do not participate in church. 3.1% are likely to become active in a church. 10.7% are likely to quit being active in a church. 86.2% are likely to make no change in their church activities.

So, what does this mean to us? We have a little growing room. Who's 3.1% that is likely to become active in a church and why couldn't that church be ours?

What else do you see our church being and doing in 5 years? Will we have children's programs? That's kind of like the chicken and the egg. You have to have children to have a children's program, and it seems that you have to have a children's program to get children in the church.

Will we have more involvement with the 55+ crowd? Will we take group trips to places around the area? Or maybe we could have a dinner club where a group got together and had dinner at someone's house, the fellowship hall, or a restaurant?

Our mission statement is to "share the love of Christ." How do you see that happening? It can't happen without us being willing to step outside the church and perhaps outside our comfort zone. Just take a hop of faith and see what God can do through you.

God's got you

In Roman 4 Paul writes: "If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ... For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace" (v. 14, 16, NRSV). Here and elsewhere, Paul firmly explains that we are saved through God's grace, or unconditional love, made known most profoundly in Jesus Christ. But this passage raises a question: If belief (trust, faith) reckons us as righteous before God, what if we don't trust, can't believe, have lost all faith?

Pastor Martin Luther (1483-1546) assures us that even this is a gift of God: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead *the Holy Spirit has* called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and *kept me in the true faith*" (*The Small Catechism*; emphasis added). Later in Romans, Paul declares that when we feel so lost (unbelieving, lacking in faith) that we don't even know how to pray, the "Spirit himself intercedes for us" (8:26, NIV). Rest assured, dear one: God's got you.
