Feed My Lambs will conclude on August 3, and is on target to serve over 1500 lunches, about the same as last year. We have had participation from 28 volunteers serving a total of over 250 hours. Some volunteers were able to come only a few times, but others have come every day. Eleven of the volunteers are from our church, with the rest coming from other churches and the community. We have received over \$2,000 in donations from civic organizations, other churches, and individuals. We give thanks for all who have donated their time, talents, and resources to provide for hungry children in Brazoria.


Watch for the addition of mini blinds in the Fellowship Building. Installation will start on the road side first.

#### Dear Ones:

For over 30 years you have generously supported my efforts in some of the neediest village schools in Guatemala. Thank you. The delights and convulsions of opening schools in January have been welcome and successful, and the children have shown up in droves. Your gifts of supplies make their education possible. As you know, a lost year almost certainly results in a childhood in the cabbage and strawberry fields.

I will begin revisiting each of the schools in August, and am asking that you continue to partner with me to provide the basic school supplies for reading, writing (in Spanish), and basic mathematics. This also provides playtime, friendships, hygiene, and a simple but joyful childhood. The hardest part to get across to these children is the idea...the very idea that someone else, somewhere else, cares enough to give them a chance for an education. Guatemala has serious problems, but the answers will not come from an uneducated populace. Notebooks and crayons get used up, and this is a project without end, but so worthwhile.

For the last 8 years, I have been able to negotiate 2 notebooks, crayons, 6 pencils, 3 pens, a vinyl eraser a ruler, and a pencil sharpener for \$2.04. Most vendors are ready to sell to me in bulk at 50% off, including free delivery to our warehouse. I will not waste a cent you send, and these children will not waste the opportunity you can give them. Will you partner with me in this transformational project? It's the gift that gives forever.

## Who, me? Yes, you!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading his people. But God always knows what he's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the

words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?'" (See Esther 4:14.)

Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in *You Were Made for This Moment*. "God always has his person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther. "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. He is the King of quiet providence, and he invites you and me to partner with him in his work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When his people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. He always has his person. He had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story he has you." —ChurchArt Pro, 9/2023.
