Older Adults and Caregivers

"If a widow has children or grandchildren, they should first learn their religious duty to their own family and make some repayment to their parents, for this is pleasing in God's sight." *1 Timothy 5:4*

When my mother was 73, we left our town to go to seminary. She had been a housewife for most of her life. Before she married my father, she had been a telephone operator for AT&T for 5 years. After Daddy died, she found herself a widow at 49. I was still at home and going to school. Mother went to work for Tyson Foods as a switchboard operator in their world headquarters. I think the job lasted about 6 months. Mom didn't take directions well.

I worked for 24 years supporting the two of us. I didn't see it coming. I didn't realize that Mom had dementia. When I decided to move to Austin in order to go to seminary, she refused to believe that we were actually going. I tried to pack as best I could, but she always told me to put her stuff back because we weren't going. She couldn't stay in the house; she didn't have enough money to do that. She would have to come to seminary and stay with me. The seminary agreed that she could.

I started to see big changes in her. She wouldn't go out of the house unless our friend Linda was taking us out to dinner. She sat in her chair all day and watched the television. She did go upstairs at night to the bedroom even though the pain in her knees was incredible.

We moved back to Arkansas, but to Harmony which was 100 miles from where we had lived. I took her to Springdale to see her doctor. But she just kept getting worse. Many days she refused to get dressed and sat in the living room nude. It also served as my office.

It was there that she ended up in a nursing home because I couldn't be there 24 hours a day to take care of her. I finally got her into a Rehab Hospital/Nursing Home in Springdale where she was very happy. Her sisters could visit her and I tried to make the run up there about twice a week.

But this isn't really about me or my mother. Although Bruce never suffered from dementia, a large number of the population will have to deal with some amount of dementia even if it is mild. And where there is an older adult with dementia or some other ailment, there is someone who is their caretaker who needs our help.

One of the things that might help people with dementia (depending upon how bad their dementia is) to seek their advise and wisdom. With age hopefully comes knowledge, skill and wisdom. We can offer to take the older adults who no longer drive to church on Sunday. Just remember that the older we get the longer it takes us to get up and get ready.

One of the things we can do for caretakers is to offer to visit with their charge so they can have some time off. Give them a gift card so they can get something for themselves without feeling guilty. Send them a note or a card of thanks. The card of thanks may not work so well with spouses (I always resented my step-daughters thanking me for taking care of Bruce like there was some option). You could send them a 'Thinking of You' or 'Praying for You' card.

Unfortunately, when it comes time to take care of an aging parent, usually one sibling carries the load. That is not to say that they consider helping their parent a burden. According to the Bible, they have a religious duty to help their parent. Regardless of how well they get along together.

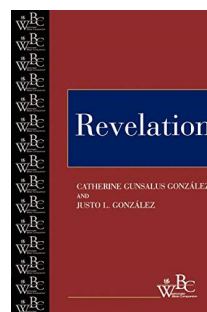

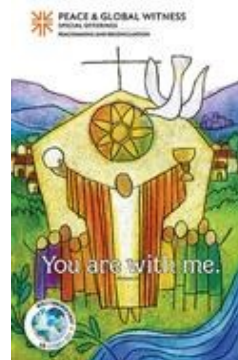

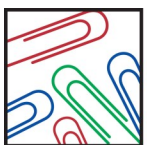
